

The Word of God

1. How much of the Bible should we believe?

Luke 24:25

Then he said unto them, O fools, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken:

2. Whom do the Scriptures reveal?

Luke 24:27

And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself (Jesus).

John 5:39

Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me (Jesus).

Revelation 1:1

The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave unto him, to shew unto his servants things which must shortly come to pass; and he sent and signified it by his angel unto his servant John:

3. What is another name for Jesus in the Bible?

John 1:1

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

John 1:14

And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

4. What kind of people did God use to write the Bible?

2 Peter 1:21

For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.

5. How important is Bible study?

Job 23:12

Neither have I gone back from the commandment of his lips; I have esteemed the words of his mouth more than my necessary food.

Matthew 4:4

But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.

Psalm 119:105

Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path.

6. Who helps us understand the Bible?

John 16:13

Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come.

John 14:26

But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you.

1 Corinthians 2:13, 14

Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual. But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.

7. What must I do to be certain the Holy Spirit is guiding my study?

Luke 11:9-13

And I say unto you, Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened. If a son shall ask bread of any of you that is a father, will he give him a stone? or if he ask a fish, will he for a fish give him a serpent? Or if he shall ask an egg, will he offer him a scorpion? If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him?

John 7:17

If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself.

8. What are the benefits of Bible study?

Psalm 119:11

Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee.

Jeremiah 33:3

Call unto me, and I will answer thee, and show thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not.

HOW DID WE GET THE BIBLE?

Romans 15:4

For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope.

James 1:5

If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him.

Psalms 111:10

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom: a good understanding have all they that do his commandments: his praise endureth for ever.

Benefits: 1) not sin, 2) learn great and mighty things, 3) have hope, 4) gain wisdom

9. How does the Bible show us how to study?

Isaiah 28:10

For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little:

2 Peter 1:20

Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation.

10. What is the ultimate purpose of Bible study?

2 Timothy 3:15

And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

11. What is the Word?

John 17:17

Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth.

12. What warning does the Bible give?

2 Peter 3:16

They that are unlearned and unstable wrest (twist), as they do also the other scriptures, unto their own destruction.

13. How should we test all religious teachings and doctrines?

Acts 17:11

They received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so.

Isaiah 8:20

To the law and to the testimony: if they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them.

1. How did we get the Old Testament?

Hebrews 1:1

God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets.

Exodus 17:14

And the Lord said unto Moses, Write this for a memorial in a book.

2. How did God give the words of these books?

Numbers 12:6-8

And he said, Hear now my words: If there be a prophet among you, I the Lord will make myself known unto him in a vision, and will speak unto him in a dream. My servant Moses is not so, who is faithful in all mine house. With him will I speak mouth to mouth, even apparently, and not in dark speeches;

3. How did we get the New Testament?

Luke 1:1-4 (NIV) – Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us, just as they were handed down to us by those who from the first were eyewitnesses and servants of the word. With this in mind, since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, I too decided to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught.

4. Why did God give the Bible?

John 20:31

But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name.

5. How do we know the Bible is true?

2 Timothy 3:16

All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

6. What did Jesus say about the Old Testament?

Luke 24:44

And he said unto them, These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me.

7. How can we understand the Bible?

1 Corinthians 2:12

Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God.

8. What can the Bible do for us?

Romans 1:16

For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek (Gentile).
